Application Checklist

Step 1 - Apply for Admission

- Fill out and return the application form with the \$20 application fee or apply online at www.threerivers.edu/enroll (select the “Online” link). You will need a credit card to complete an online application. Former applicants or students of any Connecticut Community College do not need to pay the \$20 application fee. Once we process your application you will receive an acceptance letter to the **email address** you provided on your application. If the application fee is not included with your application, payment will be collected at the time of registration.

Step 2 - Apply for Financial Aid

- Students are encouraged to complete the online free application form Federal Student Aid (FASFA) using the Three Rivers Community College school code "009765". You may complete the financial aid application at www.fasfa.ed.gov. Seven business days after completing this process, contact our Financial Aid Office at (860) 215-9040 or log into www.online.comnet.edu to find out your eligibility status. Instructions for logging into your online myCommNet account will be provided with your emailed acceptance letter.

Step 3 - Submit Supporting Documentation*

- Proof of high school completion or equivalent:** Required for students seeking a degree or certificate, as well as students applying for financial aid. Submit a copy of your high school transcript with graduation date, high school diploma, or GED certificate.
- Immunization requirements:** Connecticut State Law requires all full-time students and part-time matriculating (degree and certificate seeking) students to be adequately immunized. More information, including exemptions from this requirement, is provided in the Admissions section of our college website and in the State Immunization Policy form included with the application.
- Course Placement for English and/or math**
 - **Accuplacer Placement Test:** New first-time college students are required to complete on campus placement testing to assist with course selection for English and/or math.
 - **Prior College:** Students who have successfully completed college level math and/or English (English from a U.S. college or university) credits **may be waived** from taking the accuplacer placement test. To be waived an unofficial transcript with prior coursework **must** be presented to the academic advisor at the time of registration.
 - **SAT and/or ACT scores (if available):** Please submit a copy of your scores to the Admissions Office.
 - **High School Transcript (required if you graduated within the last 5 years) :** Please submit a copy of your transcript to the Admissions Office.

* **NOTE:** We recommend you provide these documents at the time of application, but we can begin the admission process if these items are still pending. However, all documentation must be received before you will be permitted to register for classes. **Non-Degree students simply need to demonstrate that they meet the specific prerequisites a particular class may call for.**

Step 4 - Register For Classes

Detailed information on the course registration process will be provided in your acceptance letter.

- New, First-Time college students** – After placement testing, you will be invited to meet with an academic advisor to register for your first semester and learn about our degree programs and strategies for your college success.
- Transfer or Readmitted college students** (*those who have previously attended college*) will meet with an advisor to review previous college work and select classes. Transfer/Readmitted students should bring copies of their prior college transcripts in order to facilitate the registration process.

Payment of fees is expected at the time of registration. Total tuition owed is payable by the payment date deadline specified by the college each semester. Your official financial aid award can be applied as payment. Payment plans are available if you register for 6 or more credits. Contact the Cashier's Office at (860) 215-9026 for more information.
